Although lacking recognition on the international scene, the Musée de l'Elysée is one of the major museums worldwide entirely dedicated to photography. Founded in 1985 as a museum "for photography", it examines the role of photography and makes it known to a wide audience through innovative exhibitions, both in Lausanne and abroad. A pole of excellence in terms of the conservation and enhancement of our visual heritage, the Musée de l'Elysée's remarkable collection encompasses over a million photographic objects.

Since autumn 2021, the museum has had a new identity and is now called Photo Elysée.

The museum's publications provide continuity for the museum's exhibitions and accompany all of its activities. They also include original works such as the nominees' and the winner's books for the Prix Elysée.

The diversity of titles and genres makes for a rich and varied catalogue that will soon be expanded to notably include a section on children's books.

The co-publication of a large number of books from the museum's catalogue, in conjunction with renowned editors from Switzerland and abroad, are a guarantee that these books, the photographers and their works will receive wide visibility in German-speaking Switzerland and around the world.

# COLLECTION MUSEE DE L'ELYSEE




# **THE NOMINEES' BOOK 2020 – 2022**

Drawing on personal notes, rough drafts, photographic studies and an occasional vision of the future book, the eight projects take shape along as many paths, conveying the uniqueness of their respective creators at a turning point in their professional lives, that of the midpoint in their careers.

The nominees take up the challenge of revealing their proposals for a book that they are each in the process of developing for submission to the international jury of the Prix Elysée.

The nominees' relationship with the museum, which accompanies them throughout the process, is materialized in an interview that marks the end of each portfolio. A sounding board for free expression, it enhances and sometimes sheds light on the nominees' "cartes blanches" pages.

In June 2021, Kurt Tong was nominated Laureate 2022. His personal book will be published in June 2022, in co-publication with the museum and the Atelier EXB in Paris.


















# LUIS CARLOS TOVAR/ JARDÍN DE MI PADRE


The starting point for Luis Carlos Tovar's project is a photograph, but, paradoxically, a photograph that he has never seen. It was the "proof" that his father, taken hostage in Colombia by the FARC (Revolutionary Armed Forces of Columbia), was still alive. Tovar has other traces to fill his father's silences—the titles of books that he read in the jungle, the turquoise butterflies that he kept between the books' pages, and the Amazon landscapes that he attempts to recreate in his garden—that allow him to imagine his father's pain, but never to fully understand it.










# MARTIN KOLLAR/ PROVISIONAL ARRANGEMENT

Launched in 2005 and repeated every five years, the reGeneration project devoted to emerging international photography already has four exhibitions and four published books to its credit.

Over 40 nationalities have been represented and not less than 215 artists have been exhibited: in 15 years, reGeneration will have been visited by over 600,000 people on five continents.



Chosen on the basis of recommendations from photographers from the first three editions, the 35 artists selected from among the 258 applications received provide insights into some of the contemporary challenges facing them, and the challenges that must be met by a museum that is dedicated to their art.

These challenges include ecological issues, those of equality and the construction of gender, the importance of digital distribution, as well as new questions about artistic commitment in a rapidly changing world both in terms of economics and the role of the museum.










# LIU BOLIN/ THE THEATRE OF APPEARANCES
